**22/06/14** Minutes

On a proposal from Cllr Greenway, seconded by Cllr Mrs Watson, it was unanimously **RESOLVED** following a vote that the notes from the meeting held on 30<sup>th</sup> May 2022 were approved and signed as the minutes.

**22/06/16** Financial

Councillors were provided with a financial report to 31.5.22.

**22/06/17** Platinum Jubilee Celebration Event 2022

- a) The Chairman thanked the office staff for organising an extremely successful event.
- A de-brief was held, and the negatives were the problem with the electrics in the office not being sufficient to power the urns and a comment that we had not catered for any children's entertainment.
- Approximately 530 afternoon teas served – consider having a donations box
- Toilets were delivered on Thursday afternoon and taken away on Friday evening.
- Tables and chairs were delivered in the morning and collected in the afternoon.
- Setting up with help from staff, family members and councillors.
- Road closures were in place on Manor Lane and Lincoln Road.
- Julie & Louise had prepared plates with napkins & knives on Wednesday.
- Problem with the PO electrics – too much power to cope with – electric safety check to be conducted. It meant that boiling water took time for filling the teapots.
- Band and Morris Dancers were well received.
- 12 stalls selling homemade goods, crafts, tombola etc.
- Fly past by Hurricane – went round 3 times – highlight for a lot of people
- Clearing up was done with help from staff, family members, friends and councillors.
- We were all exhausted but rewarded by a successful event and the feedback that followed. It was a cost effective exercise that was within budget.

- b) On a proposal from Cllr Mrs Watson, seconded by Cllr Greenway, it was unanimously **RESOLVED** following a vote to distribute the remaining 11 commemorative mugs amongst the staff and those who helped at the event.

**22/06/20** Future Events

Suggestions included a Farmers’ Market and Music & Arts Festival. Investigations will be made into the possibility of a market and the Deputy Clerk will visit the one in Saxilby to speak to stallholders. A festival could take place over a week at sometime in the summer months with various venues used each day for different activities. Report at next meeting.

**22/06/21** Twinning

The Clerk has still not had a response to the email sent. Cllr Briggs reported that plans for the visit by the French over the 2023 August Bank Holiday will include a reception on arrival at Manor Park and a collaborative event on the Saturday evening; plans will be expanded early in the new year.
