5. Clerk's Report

Clerk's Report 16/03/26

The Leylandi trees surrounding the Anglian Water pump site have been reported and a groundwork team has been assigned to cut back the trees at a future date (reference 28752162).

The Clerk received a letter from Welton and Dunholme Methodist Church on 13/02/26 with regards to traffic obscuring the view at the junction just outside the chapel due to the new placement of the double yellow lines. They asked that the council contact the relevant authorities to ask for an extension on the double yellow lines to prevent this traffic hazard by not allowing traffic to park right up to the corner. The Clerk has contacted the Traffic Regulation Team and has heard from Local Cllr Smith who has supported this request and now an assessment can begin. The Traffic Regulation Team have responded and said they believe no further action is needed at this time. The Clerk has asked them to come out and monitor parking during the school drop off and pick up times.

The Clerk has agreed the 2026 Highway Grass Cutting Agreement with Lincolnshire County Council.

The Clerk received an email from a member of the public on 01/03/26 with concerns that the dyke leading from Eagle Drive to Manor Park had become overgrown. This has been inspected by the Facilities Team and the undergrowth is not preventing the flow of the water and the member of the public has been informed of this and that the Council will continue to monitor it.
