10. Community Award:

Award categories:

- a. Community Involvement Award:** recognises individuals, or community voluntary groups, who have made a positive contribution to the village. Maximum of 3 awards.
- b. Youth Community Award:** recognises a young person or group of young people aged 18 or under, who have made a positive contribution to their local community. Maximum of 1 award.
- c. Art and Culture Community Award:** recognises an individual's work in a voluntary or professional level who has made a significant or outstanding contribution to the arts and culture in Welton-by-Lincoln. Maximum of 1 award.
- d. Environment Community Award:** recognises an individual or group who has made a significant difference to the conservation or protection of an area within the village. Maximum of 1 award.
- e. Independent Business Community Award:** recognises an independent business in Welton-by-Lincoln whose presence has had a positive impact on the local community. Maximum of 1 award.
- f. Honorary Freeman of Welton-by-Lincoln:** recognises a member of the community who is a person of distinction or a person who has, in the opinion of the Council rendered eminent services to the village. Maximum of 1 award.
